#### **August is World War II History Month**

Library of The Chathams is continuing to focus on a different theme each month and the focus during August will be World War II.

August 15, 2015 marks the 70th anniversary of the end of World War II. Please join us as we explore the history of the war with films as well as a presentation of oral histories from local World War II veterans.

We will also be displaying our collection of World War II materials and will be inviting members of the community to share their stories, their history, and their knowledge of World War II.

Our main event will be on **Saturday, August 22 at 2 pm**, when Chatham resident and professional narrator Tim Crow will speak about his interviews with World War II veterans from New Jersey for a project sponsored by the Library of Congress. Come listen to these veterans speak about the experiences they encountered.

For each book read and reported on, teens will earn an entry to both a weekly drawing and the grand prize drawing. Each book read must contain a minimum of 150 pages.

To report on each book read, entrants must provide a 100 word written summary/review of the book (to be printed and dropped off for Mr. Arthur or e-mailed to him at <u>jarthur@chathamlibrary.org</u>) which should also include your name, library card number, a contact phone number or e-mail address, and the title and author of the book read.

For each book read and review turned in, an entry will be earned (up to two entries per week, up to 16 total entries for the grand prize drawing).

Weekly prizes will include book bundles, movie posters, and much more!
