Summer Reading Fun For All Ages



This summer the library hosted Summer Reading Clubs for all ages and the programs attracted hundreds of participants. 737 children signed up and reported on more than 15,228 books, the highest numbers on record for the Library of The Chathams.

More than 150 written report entries were received for the teen summer reading contest, and more than 200 entries were received for the adult summer reading program as well.

The end of summer picnic, held at Memorial Park behind the library, was a fun celebration with face painting, obstacle courses, and food, and more than 400 people were in attendance.

All of these programs and the Summer Reading Clubs were made possible by the generous sponsorships of various organizations including Friends of The Library, Woman's Club of Chatham, Chatham Kiwanis, and the Chatham Jaycees, as well as countless volunteers.
